Materials

- 1 cup water
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup salt
- 1 tablespoon cream of tartar
- Food coloring
- Saucepan
- 1 cup flour

Directions

- Combine water, oil, salt, cream of tartar, and food coloring in a saucepan and heat until warm.
- 2. Remove from heat and add flour.
- Stir, then knead until smooth. The cream of tartar makes this dough last 6 months or longer, so resist the temptation to omit this ingredient if you don't have it on hand.
- 4. Please send to school in a gallon Ziploc bag.

Black History Month

This week we will learn about Bessie Coleman, who got her international pilot's license in 1921. She was one of the first women of African American descent and of Native American descent to hold a pilot's license.

We also have scheduled other students from other classrooms to teach us about the contributions of Black people in history from the projects they did in their class!
